The Board of Aldermen of the City of Springhill, Louisiana met in regular session in the Council Chambers at Springhill City Hall on Monday, September 9, 2024 at 5:00 P.M with Mayor W. Ray Huddleston presiding.

Mayor W. Ray Huddleston called the meeting to order.

Alderman Dimettera Frazier opened the meeting with Prayer.

Mayor Huddleston led the Pledge of Allegiance.

MOTION was made by Derek Melancon, seconded by Mike Whitlock to adopt the minutes from the last regular meeting held on August 12, 2024 and the Special Call Meeting held on August 19, 2024.

Main Street Manager Amie Poladian reminded everyone about the sign ordinance that was adopted last year which prohibits the placement of yard signs in the city but particularly in the Main Street District.

Two new awnings in the downtown district have gone up in part thanks to match grants for Masonic Lodge and David Smith's building at 204 Main Street. B & S Interests installed a new awning which also helps improve the downtown district appearance.

Three new businesses are opening next month on Main Street.

Lots of activities will be happening in next twelve weeks including the Farmers Markets, Springhill Rodeo, Rodeo Week on Main Street, Hay Bale Decorating Contest, Rodeo Parade, Lumberjack Festival, Parade and Car Show, Homecoming Parade, Food Truck Friday Night, Halloween, Main to Main, and Christmas on Main.

Amie encourages everyone to come and participate in all the activities that will be going on Main Street.

Mayor Huddleston presented two estimates for the cleaning of the drainage ditch from 4th Street SW to Highway 371. The first was from Budd's Construction in the amount of \$8,000.00 and the second was from Tim Smith Construction in the amount of \$10,600.00.
